### Introduction to Answers

This answer manual accompanies Cataloging Books: A Workbook of Examples by William E. Studwell and David V. Loertscher. This manual is intended for teachers and trainers of cataloging students so that meaningful practice problems and educational experiences can be designed.

#### Uses of the Manual

While there are many ways the 100 examples in the manual can be used, the authors have tested the manual and suggest these possibilities. As rules of description, classification, etc., are covered, students are assigned the appropriate example problems. For example, as the rules for the title area and statement of responsibility are covered, the students are assigned to complete Tag 245 for all or part of the examples. Using the AACR2 answer section, the instructor identifies examples which have focus problems dealing with the title and statement of responsibility rules and then assigns those focus problems. When teaching the various tables in the Dewey Decimal System, examples using Table 1, 2, etc., can be assigned by consulting the Tag082 or DDC answers. Assigning students parts of examples which exemplify rules taught is recommended over assigning them to do a single item completely, although as the semester/class comes to a conclusion, students could be asked to catalog certain examples completely. All the answers or just portions of the answers can be printed out for student use. Students can be encouraged to do the exercises and then compare their answers to what the LC cataloger did for that item.

If the instructor reserves access to answers, then certain items can be used as test items. Students can be assigned certain examples as practice problems and the balance may be used as test items. Another use of the manual is to use the examples for the cataloging class lecture. These examples can easily be found by consulting the various rule indexes.

### Notes Concerning the Answers

Answers have been drawn from OCLC using LC cataloging where available. With a few minor exceptions, the cataloging has not been altered. Thus, if there is a discrepancy between any rules in the current AACR2rev (or LC's interpretation) and the answers, instructors must warn students that the answers are correct for the time the title was cataloged and entered the system. This means that rules are interpreted current to the time of cataloging and interpretations made by the particular cataloger doing the item show up in the answers. This applies not only to the description, but also to subject headings and classification. For example, as this book went to press, LC decided to change all bibliographical notes to read "Includes bibliographical references" and also to totally eliminate index notes. Instructors may wish to change the answers as LC makes major decisions. Answers differing from rules being taught in the instructor's classroom may be altered to match the instructor's interpretation. Thus, it would be possible to have an answer sheet containing both the LC cataloger's interpretation and the cataloging instructor's interpretation.

#### **Answer Sections**

There are a number of answer sections. Each is explained below.

### Answers of a general nature

CatCards This answer section contains all 100 examples in card catalog format. Dewey and LC call numbers precede each example. Sears subjects are not included in this section but AC headings appear in brackets. No attempt has been made to format the section so that the information would fit on a 3x5 card, but paragraph style has been used.

All Answers These answer sections contain answers to their respective examples including MARC records, focus questions, and the answers to the focus questions.

### Answers Useful in Dewey Decimal Classification

Tag082 This answer section contains Dewey Decimal Classification numbers arranged by example number. For the most part, 082 numbers are from the 19th edition of Dewey as was assigned by the LC cataloger. All numbers have been checked in the 20th edition. Where there was a discrepancy, an 092 tag was added.

DDC This answer section contains all 082 and 092 tags. There are four fields: Problem (Example number), Tag (MARC tag number), DDC (Dewey Decimal Classification number), and Type (Dewey tables used).

DDC2 This answer section contains Dewey Decimal Classification numbers arranged by operation in schedules/tables. This is the order of arrangement: add from schedules, schedules only, Table 1, Table 2, Table 3, Table 4, Table 5, and Table 6. For the most part, 082 numbers are from the 19th edition of Dewey as was assigned by the LC cataloger. All numbers have been checked in the 20th edition. Where there was a discrepancy, an 092 tag was added.

DDC3 This answer section contains Dewey Decimal Classification numbers arranged by Dewey number. For the most part, 082 numbers are from the 19th edition of Dewey as was assigned by the LC cataloger. All numbers have been checked in the 20th edition. Where there was a discrepancy, an 092 tag was added.

### Answers Useful in Library of Congress Classification

LCclass This answer section contains LC classification numbers. There are two fields: Example (contains example numbers) and Class no. (contains the classification number).

LCclass2 This answer section contains LC classification numbers arranged by example number. The class numbers are from the edition of the LC schedules used at the time of cataloging.

LCclass3 This answer section contains LC classification numbers in LC class order. Class numbers come from editions of schedules current at the time that the item was cataloged at LC.

### Answers Useful in Assigning Sears Subject Headings

Sears This answer section contains Sears subject headings for all examples. The 13th edition of Sears was used. There are two fields: Example (contains example numbers) and Heading (contains the Sears headings).

Sears2 This answer section contains Sears subject headings arranged by example number. These answers have been checked against the 13th edition of Sears. MARC-type subfield tags are used instead of dashes.

Sears3 This answer section contains Sears subject headings arranged alphabetically.

### Answers Useful in Assigning Library of Congress Subject Headings

Tag6 This answer section contains 600, 650, and 651 (subject headings) for all examples arranged by example number. Note: 650 1 tags are AC headings, not Sears, and 650 2 tags are NLM headings.

### Answers Useful in Descriptive Cataloging

AACR1 This answer section contains all rule numbers used in the focus problems. There are two fields: Example (contains example numbers) and Rule (contains rule numbers). Rule numbers have been checked against AACR2rev (1988).

AACR2 This answer section contains all AACR2rev numbers used in the focus problems arranged by example number.

AACR3 This answer section contains all AACR2rev numbers used in the focus problems arranged by rule number.

Tag245 This answer section contains the 245 tags (title and statement of responsibility) for all examples arranged by example number.

Tag250 This answer section contains the 250 tags (edition statement) for all examples.

Tag260 This answer section contains the 260 tags (place of publication, publisher, and date) for all examples.

Tag300 This answer section contains the 300 tags (physical description) for all examples.

Tag4 This answer section contains the 440 and 490 tags (series statements) for all examples.

Tag5 This answer section contains the 504, 500, and 520 tags (notes) for all examples.

### Answers Useful in Assigning Main and Added Entries

Tag100 This answer section contains the 100 tags (main entry) for all examples.

Tag7 This answer section contains the 700, 710, 730 and 740 tags (added entries) for all examples.

1-1. What should be the form of the author's name?

Answer: For personal names with first and/or middle names commonly identified by initials, the initial(s) are used, followed by the spelled-out forms in parentheses. Rule 22.18A

1-2. Is "A New Edition" the subtitle or the edition?

Answer: Note that L.C. interpreted "A New Edition" as belonging in the edition area. A good case could be made for putting "A New Edition" as a subtitle and "Edited by Richard J. Finneran" in the statement of responsibility area following "Yeats." Rules 1.1E and 1.2B3

1-3. What subject headings are appropriate for collections of a single poet's works?

Answer: Generally no subject heading is assigned, unless the collection focuses on a specific theme. A subject heading such as American Poetry Collections would be incorrect, since that heading represents the collected poems of several poets.

1-4. How is the height of a book recorded in the physical description?

Answer: Rule 1.5D1 requires that dimensions be given in centimeters.

1-5. Assign and give the meaning of each digit in the DDC number.

Answer: The L.C. cataloger assigned 821/.8 to this book. The 8 = Literature; 2 = English (the country of origin of Yeats); 1 = Poetry; .8 = Victorian period. Note: The last 8 does not mean collection since all the poems are by a single author.

#### Focus Problems

2-1. What is the correct form of W.H. Auden's name as a subject heading?

Answer: Personal names as subjects or added entries are subject to the same rules as names in main entries. Therefore, the initials are used since that is the predominant form of the name used in Auden's works. Rule 22.18A.

2-2. What is the correct punctuation in the title?

Answer: Instead of a colon (which would make the balance of the title a subtitle), use a comma so that the title will be more retrievable in a computer catalog. Rule 1.1B1

Answer: Z Cutters are useful for biography and criticism of literary authors whenever the first Cutter represents the author. See the table for authors with a Cutter number (IXa in the 2nd ed. of PN, PR, PS, PZ).

2-4. A cataloger might assign three different DDC numbers to this work. What would they be?

Answer: The 821.912 number would place the work as DDC suggests with the poetry of Auden since works both by and about the author should be classed in the literature number. A 928 classification is an optional number given by DDC for libraries preferring to class all biography together. Many libraries might assign a "B" meaning biography to the book and store it with other biographies.

Focus Problems

3-1. What should you do when the title page actually covers two pages?

Answer: Treat both pages as a single page. Rule 2.0B1

3-2. Should the author's name be entered under the pseudonym "Dr. Seuss," or the real name, "Theodore Seuss Geisel?"

Answer: Under the pseudonym since it appears on the work. Rule 22.2B3 Note: The author has also used other pseudonymns.

3-3. L.C. gave two subject headings to this book: "Questions and answers -Juvenile literature; Questions and answers." Why?

Answer: The first is the L.C. subject heading. The second is the AC subject heading.

3-4. What is the DDC number for this work?

Answer: 031/.02 It may come as a surprise that an extremely simple fact book does receive a classification in 031 with encyclopedias. Assigning .02 shows that it is a collection of miscellaneous facts.

Focus Problems

4-1. What should be the correct form of the name for the compiler? He is a Malaysian writing on an Arabic subject.

Answer: According to Rule 22.27 , most Malaysian names with Arabic components are entered without inversion, but some are not. "Beg" is a surname of Indic origin, and therefore, the name is treated like an Indic name. L.C's name authority file or similar sources should be checked to verify the correct form. This is particularly true of Oriental names, many of which are not inverted.

4-2. Who is the publisher of this volume?

Answer: There is some confusion on the title page whether or not the University published this book. L.C. decided that no publisher was listed. Rule 1.4D7.

4-3. What is the main entry for this publication?

Answer: The title. A compiler, i.e. one who assembles the works of others, is not eligible for the main entry. Rule 21.1C

4-4. How is Table 6 used to build a DDC number for this item?

Answer: Classing this work in 089 is chosen over some number in literature because of the general nature of the work. At 089, the classifier is instructed to add language to the base number 089 from Table 6. The L.C. cataloger assigned 926, which encompases all the languages spoken in the Islamic world.

#### Focus Problems

5-1. What is the form of Louis XIII's name for the subject heading? Include all OCLC fields, subfields, and indicators for the OCLC tags.

Answer: Since Louis is a forename, it has the indicators "00" to go with the 600 field tags. The second indicator is always "0" for L.C.-style subject headings. The b, c, and d subfields are required for the XIII numeration, the royal title, and the birth and death dates, respectively. Rule 22.16A requires that the name of a ruler include the name itself followed by a roman numeral followed by a title.

5-2. How are plates treated in the physical description?

Answer: "p. of plates" is used in this case. Since the plates were not numbered, the cataloger counts them and puts the number in brackets. Rule

5-3. Elizabeth's maiden name is Wirth. She wrote some things under that name but has written more under her married name. How is her name entered for this book?

Answer: Rule 22.2C1 requires married women to be entered under the name they prefer to be entered or the name which predominates in their works. Furthermore, Rule 22.5C5 requires that Elizabeth be entered under Marvick, not under Wirth.

5-4. The L.C. cataloger ended the DDC number with the standard subdivision 0924. What did this mean in DDC19 and how is it different in DDC20?

Answer: The 0924 designation stands for a biographical work. This number has been discontinued in DDC20 and shortened to 092.

### Focus Problems

6-1. What is the form of the name for North and South Korea when used as subject headings? Is there any difference between a country name used as a subject heading or as a main entry?

Answer: When a country is used as a main or added entry, it functions as an organization; when it is a subject, it functions as a geographical name unless the subject is a department or other subunit of the country. In both cases, the form of the name is the same. Since there are two nations named Korea, a qualifier is needed to distinguish them from each other. The subject heading "Korea" could be used if the item pertained to the area prior to the post World War II partition. See Rule 24.6C

6-2. What is the form of the name for the author who is a U.S. citizen?

Answer: The Asian surname appears on the title page in the same order that any other U.S. surname would, so it follows the normal rule.

6-3. Which place(s) of publication should be used?

Answer: The first named place is the only place indicated unless the first place is not in the U.S., and a subsequent place is. In such cases, use the first place followed by the U.S. place. Rule 1.4C5

6-4 The L.C. cataloger ended the DDC number for this book with 519, meaning Korea in general. This is probably correct because the book explains the foreign relations systems of both countries. Suppose the book dealt with the foreign relations of North Korea with South Korea. What would the DDC number be?

Answer: The instructions at 327.3-.9 say to begin with the base number (327); add the first country number (5913) from Table 2, then a 0, and finally the second country number (5195). The result would be 327.591305195!

# Focus Problems

7-1. What should be the form of the name for the Mississippi River?

Answer: Mississippi River. Many geographical areas require some sort of qualification such as state, country or province. In this case, since the Mississippi River touches more than two states, and there is no other river of the same name, no qualification is needed. The words "Valley," "Estuary," "Watershed," and "Region" can also be added to the names of rivers.

7-2. L.C. used the full name Marquis William Childs as the main entry for this book. How would they arrive at such a decision?

Answer: If the same personal name varies in form, L.C. chooses the form most commonly found. In case of doubt, the fullest form is used. Rule 22.3A1

7-3. What is the correct form of the place of publication name to use?

Answer: The place of publication is used exactly as it appears, with two rules for guidance. One, if needed to identify the place, the country state, province, etc., is added in brackets. Two, abbreviations appearing in Appendix B of AACR2 must be used. Rule 1.4C

7-4 Since the Mississippi River touches many states and the DDC structure is divided by political entity, what is the correct number for the river?

Answer: Looking up "Mississippi River" in the index, one finds that -77 has been assigned. The note at DDC 977 provides the direction for both the Ohio and Mississippi rivers. The note at -4-7 in Table 2 also gives directions for areas and regions which cross political boundaries.

### Focus Problems

8-1. What is the form of the name for the Colorado River in the Western U.S.?

Answer: Since there are also Colorado rivers in Texas and in Argentina, Rule 23.4 suggests that a qualifier is needed despite the river being in more than two jurisdictions. Note the abbreviation of Colorado. A list of abbreviations of places is given in Appendix B of AACR2. Postal zip code abbreviations were rejected by code writers.

8-2. What is the form of the publisher's name used in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.4D2 allows the name of the publisher to be abridged as long as there is no other publisher's name which is similar.

8-3. How should an edition statement be recorded? As stated on the item, or otherwise?

Answer: Rule 1.2B1 establishes a systematic way to record numbered editions. Thus, "first edition" becomes "1st ed."

9-1. What should be the form of the name for Moscow, Russia?

Answer: Since there are a number of cities by the name of Moscow (Moscow, Idaho; Moscow, Russia), Rule 23.4 requires that a qualifier be added to distinguish one city from another. The rule requires the name of the republic or state in which the city is located to be added. This is the case for the Soviet Union, U.S., Canada, Australia, Malaysia, and Yugoslavia. Technically, "Moskva" would be the correct transliteration of the city, but L.C. uses commonly known English name forms for well-known places.

9-2. The OCLC record for this item does not contain the physical description information or the pages of the bibliography. Why can this happen?

Answer: Generally the CIP information is on the OCLC database until L.C. updates the record. In this case, L.C. has never updated the record even though several years have passed.

9-3. L.C. records the main entry as: Savas, Emanuel S. rather than Savas, E. S. How do they arrive at this form of the name?

Answer: According to Rule 22.3A1, the form of the name used by the author in the majority of his works should be used as the established form. This author has written many works under the name Emanuel S. In case of doubt on an author's name form, the fullest form is used.

9-4. What should the L.C. call number be?

Answer: The government of localities is classed in JS. A table must be used.

# Focus Problems

10-1. What should be the forms of the name for Kosovo, a city in Serbia (Yugoslavia), and for the state of Serbia?

Answer: As a city: Kosovo (Serbia) As a state: Serbia

Localities in Yugoslavia are qualified by state just as localities are handled in the U.S., Canada, Australia, the Soviet Union, and Malaysia. Rule 24.4C2

10-2. Who is really the publisher of this item? How is the distributor treated in the description?

Answer: This work is published in Boulder, Colorado, by an organization entitled East European Monographs. They have their publications distributed by Columbia University Press in New York. Rule 1.4D5 prescribes that the distributor should follow the name of the publisher if known.

10-3. How are states within countries treated when they are a part of subject headings?

Answer: Generally, states follow the rule set down in Rule 23.4C. However, in the case of the subject heading: Albania - Relations - Yugoslavia - Serbia, the name of the country (Yugoslavia) intervenes between the topic and the state (Rule 23.4E). This pattern is also true for the states in Australia and Malaysia, but is not true for the states, provinces, territories, etc. in the U.S., Canada, and the Soviet Union. Thus, the heading would be: Albania - Relations - Utah not Albania - Relations - United States - Utah.

10-4. The L.C. cataloger assigned a DDC number of 303.482+. What might be a better alternative? If the 303.4 number were used, how would the countries be added according to the 19th edition?

Answer: Without the advantage of examining the book in depth, it would appear that 327, international relations, would be a better choice. Creating a number which includes the foreign relations of one country with another involves adding the two country numbers on the end of the class as instructed. The result would be: 327./4971/04965. Why did the L.C. cataloger add country numbers to 303.4? According to the 19th edition, this is not possible unless the standard subdivision 09 were inserted after the 303.482. Looking at the 20th edition, instructions are given to add the country numbers directly without the 09; thus the L.C. cataloger was using an instruction yet to be published.

# Focus Problems

11-1. What are the forms of the name for both New York State, New York City, and Harlem (a section of New York City)?

Answer: state: New York (State) City: New York. (N.Y.)

Harlem: Harlem (New York, N.Y.)

According to Rule 23.4C2, localities in the U.S. are qualified by the state in which they are located. Places within cities are qualified by the name of the city (Rule 23.4F2). Rule 24.6B also suggests that in the case of New York State, the qualifier (State) is needed to differentiate it from the city.

11-2. Which publisher is used in field 260 when you have a reprint? How should the other publisher be treated?

Answer: Rules 1.4B2 and 1.7B7 prescribe that we use the reprint publisher of the reprint in field 260 and give the original publisher in a note (field 500).

11-3. The L.C. cataloger uses the DDC special topics number 004 to add the racial characteristic to the New York City number. Where did this authority come from? What would have been a better choice?

Answer: It is a mystery where the authority came from and why two zeros are used. This is the case both in the 19th and 20th editions. A better choice would have been to use the standard subdivision 089 and then the number for blacks.

#### Focus Problems

12-1. What is the form of the name for the National Geographic Society which is the subject of this book?

Answer: Geographical qualifiers are added to any organization which is actually in conflict with another organizational name, or may reasonably be. Rule 24.4C. Unique name forms tend not to be modified by place. L.C.'s name authority records should be checked in every case.

12-2. The L.C. cataloger recorded the title as: National geographic. Why was the word "geographic" left uncapitalized?

Answer: The cataloger made a mistake. Appendix A.4A says that proper names should be capitalized.

12-3. The verso says that Lesley Blakeney designed the book. Should his name be a part of the description?

Answer. The cataloger must decide if Blakeney deserves enough credit to mention. The publisher must not have considered his contribution important enough to put his name on the title page.

### Focus Problems

13-1. What is the form of the Society's name to be used in the subject heading?

Answer: Rule 24.4C requires a geographical qualifier for society names that are not unique. This qualifier must take on the same form the L.C. uses for the geographical area for other purposes, except for the United States, which has the form (U.S.) as a qualifier.

13-2. On the L.C. record for this entry, the first name of the author is spelled "Renbee." Why?

Answer: The "b" is a delimiter which indicates that the accent mark follows on the next letter.

13-3. What is the correct form of the publisher's name to use in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.4D2 allows us to drop "& Co." if there is no other publisher by the same name.

13-4. When two places of publication are given and both are foreign, which is given in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.4C5 prescribes that the first is listed.

Answer: The first Cutter represents the name of the Society. It isn't listed in L.C.'s classification schedule, so the cataloger must devise a Cutter number. Such improvisation with Cutters for persons, places, organizations, and topics is commonplace throughout the L.C. classification schedules. Note that the L.C. classification schedule for BF does not clearly indicate that two Cutters are needed.

13-6. The L.C. cataloger considered two different standard subdivisions for the DDC number of this item. A 06 or 072 were the choices. Which would be chosen and why?

Answer: All things being equal, the 072 would be chosen because in the table of precedence at the beginning of Table I, 07 takes precedence over 06. The manual of the 20th edition (vol. 4, p. 747) says to "Use T1-072 for organizations that conduct research, e.g., agricultural research stations in the United States 630.72073, but T1-06 for membership organizations which primarily promote research, e.g., the American Association for the Advancement of Science 506.073. If in doubt, class in T1-072."

### Focus Problems

14-1. While there is no clue on the title page, this publication is a collection of papers given at a conference. What is the main entry?

Answer: Since the conference was not prominently indicated, i.e., was not in the preliminaries, the conference cannot be the main entry. Therefore, the title is the main entry. Furthermore, the choice to make the conference an added entry can be disputed. Rule 21.30El indicates that only prominently named corporate bodies should be traced.

14-2. Two organizations are involved in the conference. What is the form of the name to be used in the added entries?

Answer: Rule 24.4C requires the Farm Foundation to be qualified by a local geographical name because there may be another farm foundation in the U.S. Rule 24.19A requires that three levels of hierarchy be used to identify the Research Service. Economic Research Service cannot stand alone, neither could Dept. of Agriculture. Research Service.

14-3. Is it permissible to record a series that is listed on the verso rather than on the title page?

Answer: Rule 1.6A2 allows the series to be recorded from any source.

14-4. The L.C. cataloger used the following note: "Published in Cooperation with the Farm Foundation and the Economic Research Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture"--Verso ser. t.p. Where did this information come from?

Answer: The verso of the special page on which the series was given.

14-5. The preface of the book gives some guidance for subject headings, but the headings assigned by the L.C. cataloger are not easy to arrive at. How do you think the L.C. cataloger arrives at headings when the topic is rather complex?

Answer: Two keys: experience, and a thorough knowledge of the structure and rules of the L.C. Subject Heading List.

14-6. What should the L.C. call number be?

Answer: Although agriculture is the subject of this book, it is classified in HD because the economic aspects of agriculture are covered. If the technical aspects of agriculture (planting, harvesting, etc.) were covered, it would be classified in S.

14-7. The L.C. classifier assigned the standard subdivision 0724 to the DDC number. That number has been changed in the 20th edition. What is the correct number?

Answer: Modeling and simulations have been put into a new subdivision for systems in 011.

# Focus Problems

15-1. What organization should be an added entry and in what form? Hint: The National Park Service is a division of the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture.

Answer: Since the conference was sponsored by four organizations, Rule 21.30Al indicates that only the first should receive an added entry. Since there is only one National Park Service in the U.S., Rule 24.19A indicates that the Dept. of Agriculture need not appear in the heading, thus the correct heading: U.S. National Park Service.

15-2. Since this book is a report of a conference, should the name of the conference be used as a main entry or an added entry?

Answer: Neither. Rule 21.30E1 indicates that only prominently named conferences should be traced.

15-3. When should a person who writes a forward or a special preface be mentioned in the description? Should this person be an added entry?

Answer: According to Rule 1.1F1 statements of responsibility appearing prominently in the item should be recorded. Rule 21.30H1 allows the cataloger to make an added entry under a name that would provide an important access point. Writers of prefaces or forewords do so to lend credence to the publication but have had little or nothing to do with its writing or intellectual content. The final judgment rests with the cataloger.

### Focus Problems

16-1. What organizations should be the added entries and in what form?

Answer: Two organizations are listed in the statement of responsibility: the Statistical Office of the U.N. and the World Bank. Since many organizations have statistical offices, the office must be entered under the higher body: United Nations. Statistical Office. On the other hand, the popular name The World Bank is not used by L.C. Since 1982, L.C. has established the name International Bank for Reconstruction and Development. Books published before 1982 will continue to use the name World Bank. However, L.C. still uses World Bank as a subject heading. Strange? No one ever said cataloging rules were always consistent.

16-2. What is the correct method of recording something "published for" someone else?

Answer: Rule 1.4D3 tells us to copy the publication statement as it appears on the title page. Furthermore, to make sense of the relationship, the word [by] is added.

16-3. How many persons or organizations can be listed in the statement of responsibility?

Answer: Rules 1.1F5 and 1.1F6 allow up to three authors of any function to be recorded. In this case, we have two producers, three authors, and five collaborators. Only one collaborator is listed in the statement of responsibility. Note also that although one collaborator could have been an added entry, her contribution was not important enough to justify an entry.

# Focus Problems

17-1. When a book becomes well known under a certain person's name and newer editions of that book are done by other persons, how long are revised editions attributed to the original author?

Answer: Rule 21.12B discusses this problem, allowing the cataloger to make an added entry for the original author/editor for one or more revisions of the book when that person's name no longer appears on the title page. Winchell had her name on the 8th edition as editor. On the 9th, her name was not on the title page, but a note about her was created and her name was traced. On the 10th edition, her name was not on the title page, and neither a note nor an added entry was made.

# 17-2. What is the statement of responsibility for this book?

Answer: Because of the many persons associated with this volume in different capacities, Rules 1.1F5 and 1.1F6 are used to construct the statement of responsibility. Three separate statements of responsibility are given; one for the editor; one for the assisters; and one for the science, technology, and medicine compilers. Since there were only three persons involved with the science, technology, and medicine parts of the book, Rule 1.1F6 would suggest that all three should be named in the statement of responsibility and all three traced as added entries. Note the use of the now obsolete qualifier "joint author" in the added entries for the 9th edition.

# 17-3. What is the subject heading(s) for this book?

Answer: For the 9th edition, the subject heading "Reference books -- Bibliography" was used and this valid heading was continued for the 10th. But, an additional heading, "Reference Books" was added for the 10th. This heading is not an L.C. heading despite the similarity to L.C.'s supplied subject. It is a National Library of Medicine heading. Note the 650 2 tag instead of 650 0 as used for L.C. headings.

# 18-1. What should be the main entry? Padwick or the title?

Answer: The terms "compiled" and "compiler" are not very meaningful. Sometimes they actually mean the editing function of gathering, reworking, and commenting on the work of others. Sometimes they mean the authorship function of producing new material. In this case, as if the case of all bibliographies, the authorship function is being performed. Therefore, according to Rule 21.1A1, Padwick becomes the main entry.

18-2. L.C. gives two L.C. classification numbers and could have given two Dewey numbers to this item. Why?

Answer: Bibliographies may be classed with other bibliographies or with the subject of the bibliography.

18-3. How should the publisher be recorded in this instance?

Answer: The publisher should be recorded as Library Association for the Cricket Society. Note that the item is pre-AACR2. Many older catalog records contain cataloging based on rules in use at the time they were cataloged but now obsolete. Even under AACR2, L.C. cataloging practice is continually under revision so that some apparent errors may not be errors at all.

18-4. DDC allows two correct numbers for bibliographies, although one is preferred by the editors. What are the two numbers and which is preferred?

Answer: 016.796358 is the preferred number and 796.358016 is the optional number.

# 19-1. What is the main entry?

Answer: Rule 21.6C2 states that if there are more than three authors, the item should be entered under title. The statement of responsibility lists only the first author followed by "... [et al.]" Rule 1.1F5

19-2. What capitalization is used in the main entry?

Answer: The word "Forces" is capitalized according to Appendix A.4D1 because the first word of a title main entry is an article. Therefore, the first meaningful word is capitalized.

# 19-3. How is the publisher of this book recorded?

Answer: This particular book was published in the U.S. by Oxford, but retains the British title page listing Clarendon Press as the publisher. Since this book is being cataloged in the U.S., Rule 1.4C5 requires that both places and publishers be listed.

20-1. What is the main entry for this publication?

Answer: According to Rule 21.7 editors are not given main entry status.

20-2. When complicated and extended responsibilities for editorship are given on the title page, what should be done?

Answer: This book is so troublesome that the creators of the title page should be shot. Rule 1.1F5 allows up to three persons/organizations for any function to be listed in the statement of responsibility. There are five different functions listed on this title page, thus five parts to the statement of responsibility, each separated by a semicolon.

20-3. What is "A Wiley-Interscience Publication?"

Answer: One might think that a series is being listed however, after experience, one learns that the title refers to a division of the company rather than a true series. For this reason, the name should be recorded in a note rather than in the series area.

20-4. How is the publisher's name recorded?

Answer: Rule 1.4D2 allows the name to be shortened to "Wiley" since there isn't another publisher with a similar name.

20-5. How is the place of publication listed by a U.S. cataloger? A cataloger in Great Britain?

Answer: For a cataloger in the U.S., Rule 1.4C5 requires only New York to be listed. For a cataloger in Great Britain, however, the place of publication would be listed as New York; a Chicester.

# 21-1. What is the main entry?

Answer: Rule 21.1B2a dictates that works "emanating" from corporate bodies and which are substantially about the body are to be entered under the name of the body (i.e., as the main entry). These publications would include histories, activities, holdings, standards or policies of the organization. Such publications would also have a subject heading for the corporate body with or without subdivision. Rule 24.1A requires that the corporation be recorded under the name by which it is predominantly identified.

21-2. The title page in this case is a good example of the way a publisher often distinguishes between the main title of a publication and its subtitle. How is that done?

Answer: By the use of different typefaces, type sizes, or position.

# 22-1. What are the main and added entries?

Answer: Rule 21.1B2a states that since the drawings are part of the gallery's permanent holdings, the gallery should be the main entry with the gallery also included as a subject. The Traveling Exhibition Service and the Ackland Art Museum are added entries because the former was the organizer of the exhibition and the latter was the first-mentioned organization in the list of participants. Rule 24.13A also requires that the Traveling Exhibition Service be listed as subordinate to the Smithsonian Institution.

22-2. When creating an L.C. subject, what is the use of the subdivision "exhibitions" vs. "catalogs?"

Answer: The subdivision "exhibitions" is designated to be used for exhibition catalogs rather than the term "catalog."

22-3. What should the L.C. call number be?

Answer: A table and a subtable must be used.

# Focus Problems

23-1. What is the main entry for a state law?

Answer: Rule 21.31B1 requires that texts of laws receive the main entry of the jurisdiction followed by a uniform title for the individual law or compilation of laws. Rule 25.15A2 requires that a uniform title be created for a single law.

23-2. How is the publisher listed in the publication, distribution, etc., area when the same organization is indicated in the main entry?

Answer: Rule 1.4D4 provides that the name of the publisher can be shortened when it is mentioned in the title and statement of responsibility area.

23-3. What is the correct form of the added entry for the Division of Meat, Poultry and Livestock Inspection?

Answer: Rule 24.19A allows us to begin the entry with the name of the state, then skip over the "Department of Agriculture" and go directly to the Division, since there is only one Division of Meat ... in the Department.

23-4. How is the place of publication recorded?

Answer: Rule 1.4C3 requires that the name of the state or country be added to the place if it is not one of the major city names which are allowed to stand alone.

# 24-1. What should the main entry be?

Answer: Rule 21.1B2D requires that a symposium with a clearly stated name mentioned in the preliminaries (title page, verso, cover, spine, and pages preceding the title page) have the name of the symposium as the main entry.

24-2. The L.C. call number generally ends with the date of publication. In this case, the correct ending is 1984. Why?

Answer: Any time a conference or symposium is the main entry, the date of the conference is used in the call number rather than the date of publication.

# 25-1. What is the main entry for this publication?

Answer: It appears that this publication was part of the same conference as example #24. Evidently, during the main conference, this short satellite symposium was a part of the program. Since this conference part does not have a distinctive name, Rule 21.1B2d directs us to enter this publication under title.

# 25-2. Can the name of the main conference be an added entry?

Answer. Yes, Rule 21.30E1 allows a secondary or tangential part of a conference to be an added entry in the same form as the conference as a whole if it is prominently named.

# 25-3. How is the publisher listed in the description?

Answer: Since there is no other publisher by the same name (How does the cataloger know? Look it up in a directory if uncertain.) Rule 1.4D2 allows the cataloger to shorten the name.

# 26-1. What should the main entry for this book be?

Answer: The decision to make the symposium the main entry is debatable. When terminology such as "a symposium" as contrasted to "the symposium" or when the first letters in the name of the symposium ar not capitalized, the cataloger might well be tempted not to make the conference the main entry.

26-2. L.C. uses the subdivision "Persian Gulf Region" as part of one of the subject headings. When can the term "Region" be used?

Answer: The term "Region" can be used after any geographic area when it makes sense. Likewise, "Metropolitan Area" can be used after any city which has an official metropolitan area.

# 26-3. What should the L.C. call number be?

Answer: A table and a subtable must be used here. The Cutter P5 has been assigned by L.C. to the Persian Gulf region. The 2 after P5 is derived from the subtable.

# 26-4. What is the DDC number for this item?

Answer: Use of the schedules above produces the number 333.8/232. Since there are no restrictions on area given, a 09 is added, then the 536 from Table 2.

27-1. What should the main entry be?

Answer: Because of the wording "An International Symposium," the decision was to make the title the main entry.

27-2. The L.C. record for this item has the designation "ed." listed after T.B. Bagenal's name. Why?

Answer: Older rules allowed ed. for editor, tr. for translator, comp. for compiler, etc., but now all those designations have been dropped.

27-3. L.C. catalogers recorded the place of publication as \*Old Working.\* Anything wrong with this?

Answer: According to AACR2 (published after this work was cataloged) the correct way to record the place of publication is "Old Working, Surrey, England."

27-4. Which is correct, to record F.A.O. or F. A. O.?

Answer: Rule 1.1B6 recommends that no spaces be used in initials.

27-5. None of the notes at DDC number 620.001 indicates that the number can be expanded further. How does one know that this is possible?

Answer: Any time the cataloger recognizes that a standard subdivision is being used, Table 1 can be used to expand the number if appropriate.

Focus Problems

28-1. What should the main entry be?

Answer: Although the title page clearly indicates "The 8th International Conference," there is no statement in the form "Conference on..." In the absence of a clear and precise conference title, the title becomes the main entry. Rule 21.1B2d.

28-2. The United Kingdom record for this item does not list "Congresses" as a subdivision of the subject headings assigned. Why?

Answer: They made an error. Also note that their call number is incomplete. There is no second Cutter nor a date.

28-3. How should the paging be listed for this item since it is in two volumes?

Answer: Rule 2.5B17 states that for multivolume books, only the number of volumes is recorded, not the paging, unless the set of volumes is continuously paged (Rule 2.5B20). Since the volumes are continuously paged, the 300 line should be 2v. (xix, 917 p.); c 24 cm. The 950 in brackets is incorrect. This example demonstrates that OCLC records cannot necessarily be taken as given. They may be incorrect and/or incomplete.

# 29-1. What should the main entry be?

Answer: Recurring meetings of organizations are treated as conferences, except that the field used is 110 or 710 instead of 111 or 711. Note that the name of the meeting is treated as a hierarchical subunit of the organization after the subfield notation "b."

29-2. The L.C. cataloger listed a 650 2 subject heading for this item which was identical with a 650 0 subject heading. Why?

Answer: The 650 2 heading is for the National Library of Medicine system. Note also that there is a 060 call number for the Library of Medicine.

30-1. Should there be a uniform title for this publication, and if so, in what form?

Answer: Uniform titles are frequently made for the original title in another language. The original German title was indicated on the verso of the title page. Initial articles are deleted in uniform titles unless needed for grammatical reasons. The language of the translation is added after the original title. Rules 25.2A and 25.5Cl

30-2. Should a translator listed on the title page receive an added entry?

Answer: Rule 21.30K1 indicates that translators are added entries only in a few circumstances, none of which applies here.

30-3. No series is listed either on the title page or on the verso, yet this item does belong to a series. To what lengths should the cataloger go to identify the series?

Answer: Rule 2.0B2 indicates that the series can be recorded from anywhere in the publication

#### Focus Problems

32-1. Should there be a uniform title, and in what form should it be?

Answer: Uniform titles are frequently made for collections of a well-known author's works. Rule 25.10A. As only a single literary form is included in the book, the special name for the literary form is indicated followed by the notation "Selections" to show that the collection is only partial.

32-2. How can the cataloger trace the title for this book so that it can be found by the maximum number of patrons?

Answer: In addition to the title page title: Faulkner's MGM Screenplays, L.C. traced the same title with periods after the three letters because MGM files in the Mgs while M.G.M. files at the beginning of the Ms. L.C. also traced the title: M.G.M. screenplays because the author's name is at the beginning of the title page title. MGM screenplays could also have been traced. See Rule 21.30J1.

32-3. What subject headings can be assigned to the collected or selected literary works of an author?

Answer: In some cases, L.C. allows a literary form to be assigned, i.e., Moving-picture plays. In cases where there is a theme or special characteristic to the collection, a heading can be added. Generally, however, no subject headings are allowed. But is this a good decision? Collected, selected, and individual fiction, poetry, drama, picture books, and other literary works are not well handled either by L.C. subject headings or Sears. L.C. has assumed for many years that people who want a fictional work already know it by the author's name or by title. The Sears list of subject headings allows headings such as Dogs - Fiction, Mystery and Detective S tories, Science Fiction, Cats -- Poetry; Frogs -- Drama, etc. but picture books lack good subject access.

32-4. Should all the works included in a collection be listed in a note? Which of these should be traced?

Answer: Catalogers have never treated the card catalog as an in-depth index to the collection. Literary works in collections are not traced unless there are three or fewer works in a single volume or there is a multivolume set in which each volume is separately cataloged and the three or fewer dictum applies. In this case, the L.C. cataloger listed all the contents in a note but did not trace any of the individual titles. In an automated catalog which has the power to search the notes field, this allows every play title to be retrieved. In a card catalog, none of the titles would be retrievable. Smaller libraries which need every volume to serve patrons to the fullest should consider tracing as many titles as possible in the card catalog.

32-5. When the title page lists the name Bruce F. Kawin, and the verso says Bruce Kawin, how does one establish the correct form of the name to use in the main entry?

Answer: Rule 22.2Al requires the cataloger to use the form of the name that the author uses in his works. The L.C. cataloger, in this case, had to look at other works written by this author to check the predominant form of the name in use.

32-6. What should the L.C. call number be?

Answer: Use the table for authors with a Cutter number (IXa requires that A6 be used for selections of an author's work in the original language).

#### Focus Problems

33-1. What is the title of this book?

Answer: Artists sometimes design cover pages for effect, but this does not dictate any difference in the order of the words used for the official title. Occasionally, it will be necessary to check a publisher's catalog to see what the official title is, if the artist was too creative.

33-2. What should the punctuation in the title and statement of responsibility area be?

Answer: A comma should follow Cagney to make the title longer and thereby increase retrieval potential (Rule 1.1B1). A comma should follow Warren to clearly separate the distinct functions of the authors.

33-3. How are unnumbered plates not covered by the paging listed in the physical description area?

Answer: Rule 2.5B10 indicates that unnumbered plates which are not part of the paging are to be counted and that number placed in brackets. If the plates are printed on both sides, they are counted as pages. If printed on one side, they are counted as leaves.

33-4. L.C. chose Warren to be the main entry for this book. Why? Shouldn't Cagney be the main entry since it is his biography?

Answer: Rule 21.6B1 states that when there is a joint authorship, the first listed should receive the main entry. The choice has nothing to do with fame. Both names will be retrievable in the catalog, so the choice is really irrelevant as far as access is concerned.

33-5. What should the L.C. call number be?

Answer: The first Cutter represents the biographee, Cagney. If Cagney had been the main entry, the second Cutter would have been A3 for autobiography.

#### Focus Problems

34-1. What is the correct form of the statement of responsibility when there are two authors but there is no connector such as "and?"

Answer: Rule 2.1F suggests the cataloger should place a comma between the names of persons in the statement of responsibility where none exists on the title page.

34-2. What allowances are made for parts of names such as "Jr." or "III" in the statement of responsibility versus the names used in the main entry, an added entry, or as a subject?

Answer: Rule 1.1F7 allows these parts of the name to appear in the statement of responsibility but not as a part of main entry, added entry or as a subject heading.

34-3. Is the word "Inc." generally used as part of the publisher's name in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.4D2 prescribes that this word may be dropped if it is not needed for identification.

34-4. The cover designer and the manufacturing buyer are listed on the verso but not on the title page. Should persons like this receive mention in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.1F2 discourages peripheral contributions to be listed when they are not on the title page. If, however, the cataloger finds the name of a major contributor to the book not listed on the title page, that person should be included in the description as a note.

34-5. The verso states that Prentice-Hall is really a division of Simon  $\epsilon$  Schuster. Which name is listed in the description?

Answer: The actual publisher or publishing division is always indicated. Affiliations such as corporate ownership or parent companies are ignored.

35-1. What should be the title and the statement of responsibility including the correct punctuation, for this book?

Answer: Rule 1.1A1 prescribes that the main title should be followed by a colon and then the subtitle. The subtitle is followed by a slash and then the statement of responsibility is presented. The GMD, if there is one, is placed between the title and the subtitle.

35-2. How is Dr. Cline's title treated in the statement of responsibility?

Answer: Rule 1.1F7 does not allow titles of address and honor, academic degrees, etc. to be listed in the statement of responsibility unless they are needed for reasons of grammar, sense, or identification, or if it is a title of nobility or British title of honor. Such titles are also deleted in the person's name when used as a main entry, added entry, or subject.

35-3. Since the title contains an ampersand and an initialism (CIA), how are these made searchable in an automated catalog when someone types in "and" or "C.I.A.?"

Answer: A normal title added entry will be made. Two more title added entries will be made to provide the slight variations which would not be retrieved otherwise.

35-4. L.C. listed a variant title for this book as: CIA under Regan, Bush, and Casey. What is wrong?

Answer: The cataloger misspelled President Reagan's name, thus loosing the entry both in a card catalog or in an automated one if not caught or corrected.

35-5. Nowhere on the title page or the verso is there a mention that this book is a revised and expanded edition of some other book. This information is found in the preface. Does this mean that the cataloger must read the preface for every work cataloged? How should this information be treated?

Answer: The cataloger has the responsibility to delve into a work enough to ferret out information such as previous editions. Sometimes the information needed is buried in parts of the book not usually read carefully. In this case, a note should be made. Rule 2.0B2 allows us to make a note from any source of information.

36-1. What should the statement of responsibility be?

Answer: Rules 1.1F6 and 1.1F5 allow the cataloger to record up to three names of any function separated by a semicolon. In this instance, there are an author, an editor, and a coordinating editor, all of them are listed on the title page. In addition, persons or organizations listed in the statement of responsibility should be given added entries if they fit the criteria in Rule 21.30.

36-2. The L.C. cataloger used two subdivisions of main subject headings for this book: Data processing and Computer programs. When you consult the L.C. Subject Heading List, such subdivisions do not appear under main terms. Why?

Answer: They are listed in L.C.'s Subject Cataloging Manual as subdivisions which can be used as needed after any appropriate topic.

36-3. Is the exclamation mark in the title listed in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.1B1 allows the cataloger to record the punctuation on the title page unless it interferes with the prescribed punctuation.

36-4. How is the name of the publisher recorded in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.4D2 prescribes that since "Computer Book Division" cannot stand on its own, the main part of the publisher's name should be added. The "Inc." may be dropped.

# Focus Problems

37-1. Is "Herman Melville" the title of this book? Or are the 6 individual stories the title of the book? How is this handled in the description?

Answer: After investigating the title page, cover, publisher's catalog, etc. the cataloger has determined that this book does not have a collective title, that the title consists of the 6 individual story titles. In this instance, Rule 1.1G3 prescribes that each of the titles be listed in the order of the title page and separated by semicolons.

37-2. What is wrong with the spelling of the author's name on the title page?

Answer: "Meville" should have been "Melville." In such a case, Rule 1.0F1 requires the cataloger to construct a correct main entry but record the error as is, in the statement of responsibility followed by "[sic]". In this case, the L.C. cataloger did not follow the rule. Perhaps the cataloger did not notice the misspelling.

37-3. What is the name of the publisher of this book? The Library of America?

Answer: After a study of the title page, the verso, and publisher's catalogs, the cataloger has determined that "The Library of America" is a series title, not the name of a publisher. The publisher turns out to be "Literary Classics of the United States, Inc." which has its publications distributed by Viking Press.

37-4. Should all of the stories receive an added entry?

Answer: L.C. practice indicates that up to three titles may be given an added entry. In this case, the L.C. cataloger has decided to give an added entry only to the first story since there are six separate titles. In a small library, the cataloger might wish to trace all titles. In an automated catalog, a program capable of searching parts of the title field, all titles would be retrievable.

37-5. Does Harrison Hayford get recorded in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.786 allows persons of importance to be recorded in a note even if they are not listed on the title page, but the L.C. cataloger must not have judged Hayford's role to be important enough.

After trying to catalog this publication, one might conclude that the publisher should be shot for harassing catalogers. A second solution would be to wait until someone else has cataloged the book before doing it. A third solution would be to conveniently loose the book.

37-6. What is the L.C. classification number?

Answer: This is a tricky one. Using the proper table in the 1978 edition of PN, PR, PS or PZ, the classification numbers PS 2382 or PS 2381.5 could be derived depending on the cataloger's interpretation of whether to use the number for "selected works" or "selections." Also, there is no indication what should follow the classification number. Not included in the table was the allowable option of using just date if there was no named editor. In subsequent additions and changes, PS 2382 was changed to mean "Quotations, extracts, etc." and so PS 2381.5 would now be preferred, again with only the date added.

37-7. The L.C. cataloger created a uniform title for this work. What should it be?

Answer: Rule 25.9A recommends that works by an author in various genres be given the uniform title, "Selections."

37-8. Assign the official DDC number to this item and then provide a common alternative.

Answer: 813.3 is the official number, but most libraries would assign "F" for fiction and shelve alphabetically by author.

38-1. How should the edition of this publication be recorded?

Answer: Rule 1.2Bl prescribes that editions are transcribed exactly as given, including any statements of responsibility relating to the edition, with the exception that standard abbreviations are used for ordinal numbers: "1st" for "first," etc. Check Appendix B to AACR2 for the correct abbreviations.

38-2. How is the place of publication listed?

Answer: Rule 1.4Cl requires that the place of publication be listed as recorded on the title page or the verso. In this case, "U.S.A." is recorded as listed.

# 38-3. Who is the publisher of this book?

Answer: In researching this publication, the L.C. cataloger determined that "Elisabeth Sifton Books" is a very broad publisher's series of Viking. In this case, the cataloger decided to record Viking as the publisher and "Elisabeth Sifton Books" as a note rather than as a specific series.

# 38-4. How are colored illustrations listed in the description?

Answer: Rule 2.5C3 prescribes that the words "(some col.)" be added when appropriate after the designation "ill."

39-1. How should the edition for this book be recorded?

Answer: The verso of the title page lists two editions. Comparison of the ISBN numbers with the item in hand would show that the Grove Press Edition is for the hard cover book and the Evergreen Edition is for the paperback version. The cataloger would record the edition of the item being cataloged as listed, i.e., "First Grove Press Edition," or "First Evergreen Edition" but would use standard abbreviations: "1st Grove Press ed." or "1st Evergreen ed." See Rule 1.2B1

39-2. How is the title and statement of responsibility for this book recorded?

Answer: This book has a main title, a subtitle (indicated by smaller letters on the title page), and an author. Those elements are copied from the title page using the prescribed punctuation listed in Rule 1.1Al.

39-3. When can two areas be added to a DDC number?

Answer: Only when instructed to do so as in this example.

#### Focus Problems

40-1. How should the edition statement for this book be recorded?

Answer: There are differing edition statements on the title page and the verso of the title page. According to L.C. practice, both should be recorded. Information about the first edition by a different publisher is recorded in a note.

40-2. How is the number of the item within a series recorded?

Answer: Rule 1.6G1 requires that the number be recorded after the series name.

40-3. The L.C. cataloger assigned six subject headings to this book. What is the normal number of headings recommended for an item?

Answer: Generally, no more than three have been assigned most likely to keep the number of catalog cards to a minimum. However, in automated catalogs, the number of subject headings can and should be increased to assist in improved retrieval.

40-4. The L.C. cataloger assigned two standard subdivisions 05 and 0924 to the DDC number for this item. Is that permissible? Under what circumstances?

Answer: Two standard subdivisions are to be assigned only when instructed to do so. That authority is in doubt in this case. Also, the table of precedence requires that 0924 be added before the 05. Also, DDC20 drops the 4 in 0924.

Focus Problems

41-1. What should the publication, distribution, etc., area be for this publication by a U.S. cataloger?

Answer: Since the first-named place of publication on the verso is New York, Rule 1.4C5 dictates that New York be listed and all others ignored. The full form of the place "New York, N.Y., U.S.A." was transcribed because that is how it actually appeared. Rule 1.4C1. Since "Viking Kestral" was the form of the publisher's name mentioned on the title page and also at the top of the verso, that form was used instead of "Viking Penquin."

41-2. What should the L.C. classification be?

Answer: Children's literature is generally classed in P27 (Juvenile literature in English) followed by an author Cutter, title notation, and date. An alternative could be to classify juvenile authors along with other authors in the various literature classifications in other parts of "P." Juvenile nonfiction can be classed with the rest of nonfiction.

42-1. What should the publication, distribution, etc., area be for this publication by a U.S. cataloger?

Answer: Distributors other than the publisher should be listed in the 260 field. Rule 1.4D6. The difference between a distributor and a jobber should be understood by the cataloger. Some jobbers will affix a label to a book cover claiming distributorship. Jobbers are not recorded in the description. The distribution information for this book was easy to find, since it was printed on the verso of the title page. Distribution is not always easily determined. If the context indicates there is a distributor, such data should be recorded in field 260 using [Distributed by] followed by the name, or the name followed by [distributor]. Rules 1.4D3 and 1.4E1.

42-2. The subtitle on the title page is enclosed in parentheses. Are those marks used in recording the title?

Answer: number Rule 1.181 requires us to record the title as is except for punctuation, which is left to the cataloger's discretion.

43-1. What should the publication, distribution, etc., area be for a cataloger in the U.S.?

Answer: Publishing relationships between organizations typically expressed "somebody for somebody else" or "somebody by somebody else" must be fully transcribed. Rule 1.4D3. "Oxfordshire" used as a qualifier was used because "Oxford" is not a unique name. The British location is listed first followed by the first U.S. place listed because of Rule 1.4C5.

43-2. What is "Cookson Ceramics & Antimony Ltd, Stoke-on-Trent, UK" which is printed on the title page? Should it be included in the description?

Answer: It is the company where the two authors work. No, it should not be listed.

43-3. The L.C. cataloger created an added entry for the Institute of Ceramics. Why? What is the form that this name should take?

Answer: Evidently, the cataloger considers the institute to be more than just a publisher in this case. Publishers normally do not receive added entries. Rule 21.30E1. The form of the name includes its name with the qualifier (Great Britain). Great Britain is spelled out because there is no AACR2 abbreviation in Appendix B14.

43-4. When there are two authors to a book, what is the order in which they appear in the catalog record?

Answer: Rule 21.6B1 indicates that the first author listed is given the main entry and the second is given an added entry.

### Focus Problems

44-1. What should the publication, distribution, etc. area be for a cataloger in the U.S.?

Answer: Rule 1.4D3 requires us to list both publishers when they are connected with "by" or "for." A copyright date is used since there is no date of publication listed on the title page. Rule 1.4F6. London is listed first plus the first U.S. place to satisfy Rule 1.4C5.

44-2. The L.C. cataloger created the following added entry: Atlantic papers (Paris, France); no. 64 for the series. Why was a location added?

Answer: L.C. practice indicates that series of the same name be distinguished in some way. In this case, a location becomes that distinguishing characteristic. How would the cataloger know this? Names of series are generally checked against an authority list.

44-3. What is the L.C. classification?

Answer: Service industries in general are classified as shown. A table must be used. If service industries in a specific place were the subject, a subtable might be needed.

#### Focus Problems

45-1. What should the publication, distribution, etc. area be for a cataloger in the  $U,S,\ref{S}$ 

Answer: Rule 1.4D3 requires us to list both publishers, but in this case, the cataloger should insert the word "by" in brackets to indicate the relationship and make grammatical sense. Cambridgeshire is added as a qualifier to Cambridge to distinguish more than one place of the same name.

45-2. What is the main entry and the title for this publication?

Answer: Since the conference name is clearly stated on the title page, Rule 21.1B2d requires that it be used as the main entry. The name of the meeting is listed followed by the year and the place. Rule 1.1B3 requires that the title be listed even though it repeats the main entry words.

45-3. In a DDC number, how does the cataloger know how many zeros to add in the standard subdivison?

Answer: The directions at the number under consideration will provide the instruction whether 2 or 3 zeros are to be added. If there are no instructions, then a single zero is used.

## Focus Problems

46-1. This book has little text and consists mostly of illustrations. What should the illustration statement be?

Answer: Rule 2.5C6 allows the phrase "chiefly ill." to be used. In similar cases, "chiefly col. ill." could be used, or, where there is no text or virtually none, "all ill." or "all col. ill." is used.

46-2. What added entries for title should be made for this book?

Answer: Because of the large typeface used, the L.C. cataloger traced "Typefinder." Rule 21.29C encourages the tracing of any parts of the title that the user might believe is the actual title. A case could be made that "International typefinder" might also be traced.

46-3. The L.C. cataloger preceded the copyright date of 1983 with the publication date of 1986. This date is neither on the title page nor on the verso. When and how is such a date listed?

Answer: According to Rule 1.4A2, dates can be supplied from any source, although if they are not on the title page or the verso, they must be put in brackets. In this case, the cataloger discovered that the book was issued in 1986 although it had been copyrighted three years earlier in England. Publication in the U.S. was delayed.

### Focus Problems

47-1. Since this is a book with an accompanying test/picture book, how is the physical description recorded?

Answer: Had both books been considered a continuous presentation of content, Rule 2.5B17 indicates that the designation "2 v." be used for two volumes. However, the cataloger judges that this is actually a book with an accompanying book of pictures which are used in administering the test. In such a case, the main item is described first and then an accompanying piece is described. Rule 2.5E1.

47-2. In the case of obscure or very small publishers, is anything besides the place of publication and the publisher's name recorded in the 260 field?

Answer: L.C. practice allows actual street addresses of an obscure publisher to be added at the discretion of the cataloger.

47-3. The accompanying picture book does have a title. What is that title and where is that title recorded?

Answer: From the title page of the picture book, several titles might be assumed: "DTLA-2; Detroit Tests of Learning Aptitude; Picture Book" or "DTLA 2 Picture Book." The L.C. cataloger did not choose to record the title of the picture book. It could have been recorded in a note. Note that the L.C. cataloger did trace the title "DTLA-2" for users who might know the test/picture book by that title.

47-4. What is the subject heading for a test such as this one?

Answer: LCSH allows the names of actual tests to become subject headings.

### Focus Problems

48-1. How should the accompanying microfiches to this book be treated in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.5El provides for the mention of additional materials if in a different format in the physical description area. This means that the cataloger could have described the microfiche as " + 4 microfiches." Instead, the L.C. cataloger chose to describe the microfiche in a note.

48-2. What is the main entry for this publication?

Answer: Because this work contains the holdings of the museum, the museum becomes the main entry. Rule 21.1B2a. Note that the name of the museum is followed by the designator (U.S.) to distinguish it from other museums of the same name. Robin Bolton-Smith, who assembled and selected the paintings for inclusion, is treated as an editor and receives an added entry.

48-3. The L.C. cataloger uses the subdivision "Catalogs" for this publication. What is the difference between that subdivision and Bibliography — Catalogs?

Answer: The subdivision Catalogs refers to actual holdings of a library, whereas Bibliography -- Catalogs refers to a bibliography (a list of books) of library holdings.

# Focus Problems

49-1. How should the accompanying sound discs be handled?

Answer: Rule 1.5E1 allows accompanying materials in a different format to be listed as part of the physical description. A note provides information on their location as needed.

49-2. If you had the original book by Leon Dallin, could this workbook and accompanying discs be described on the same catalog entry without making a separate entry?

Answer: Yes. Both the workbook and the sound recordings could have been considered accompanying materials to the textbook and listed in the physical description area of the text.

49-3. If this workbook is cataloged as a separate item from the textbook of the same title, how are the two linked for the user?

Answer: Rules 21.29F and 21.30G1 allow that linking can take place in a note and also in an added entry. In this case, the name of the textbook was given in the title so a note was not needed.

49-4. How is the edition for this item recorded?

Answer: Rule 1.2B1 allows us to use numerals instead of words to describe the edition numbers, thus, 5th ed., not Fifth Edition.

49-5. There is a consulting editor listed on the verso. Why isn't he listed in the statement of responsibility?

Answer: Rule 2.0B2 indicates that editors should be listed on the title page in order to merit mention in the statement of responsibility.

49-6. Five copyright dates are listed on the verso. Which one(s) should be recorded in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.4F1 indicates that only the date of the edition in hand should be listed. The other dates refer to the previous editions.

#### Focus Problems

50-1. This book has black-and-white pictures, color pictures, portraits, facsimiles, plans, and maps. What should the illustration statement be?

Answer: Rule 2.5C2 prescribes that the abbreviation "ill." be listed first followed by other types of illustrations included in alphabetical order. "Col." is used with any of the illustration types if appropriate.

50-2. The preface is dated 28 August 1986. No other date is listed on the title page or verso. How should this date be recorded?

Answer: Rule 2.082 prescribes that a date not found on the title page, verso, other preliminaries, or colophon should be recorded in brackets.

50-3. The name of this series is pretty mundame. Should it be recorded as is or enhanced by the cataloger?

Answer: The series name should be recorded in the series area according to Rule 1.6E1. When series titles consist of just generic or common names such as "monograph" or "publication," they are qualified by the official name of the organization in parentheses and traced as 830 0 added entries.

# Focus Problems

51-1. How should the series for this book be recorded?

Answer: There are two distinct series listed for this book on the title page. Rule 1.6J1 requires that both be listed.

51-2. The L.C. cataloger used a subdivision of the subject heading -- Research. What does this term mean?

Answer: LCSH uses this term to indicate methods, facilities, personnel, etc. for conducting research. However, the results of research are not assigned subjects with the subdivision Research.

51-3. When a title on the spine differs from the recorded title, should any mention be made in the description?

Answer: Rule 2.784 recommends that a note be made. The cataloger is also at liberty to make the spine title an added entry if users would be expected to know that title in preference to the title page title or if the variant title is significantly different.

51-4. What is the main entry for this book?

Answer: Rule 21.7B1 prescribes that works created by an editor are entered under title with an added entry for the editor.

# Focus Problems

52-1. How should the series of this book be recorded?

Answer: Rule 1.6Bl requires that the cataloger list the series as printed even though there is a complete organizational name listed in the series title.

52-2. The preface says that this publication is the first of the EORTC Study Group on Quality of Life. No mention of this group is made on the title page or the verso. Should it be listed/traced?

Answer: Rule 21.29C indicates that any important group responsible for the publication, whether named on the title page or not, may receive mention. In this case, the L.C. cataloger chose to list the group's work in a note and then make an added entry under the group's name.

52-3. How many editors can be listed in the statement of responsibility?

Answer: Rules 1.1F5 and 1.1F6 allow up to three persons/organizations of any function to be listed in the statement of responsibility. In this case, two editors and two associate editors can be listed.

### Focus Problems

53-1. How should the series for this book be recorded?

Answer: Here is a series by the title of "Monograph Series" which is issued by the Society for New Testament Studies. Rule 1.2Cl allows the cataloger to record a series name and a statement of responsibility for the series. The number whithin the series is recorded after the statement of responsibility.

53-2. The subject of this book is the Book of Luke and Acts in the New Testament. How are books of the Bible recorded in main entries or in subject entries?

Answer: Rule 25.18 covers the form of entry for parts of the Bible. The order is: Bible. Part. Book. Language. Version. Year. Elements not relevant are not listed. In this case, Bible. Part. Book. are the only relevant elements.

53-3. How is the name of Saint Luke recorded as a subject entry?

Answer: Rule 22.13 requires that the word "Saint" be added after the person's name.

### Focus Problems

54-1. When the name of the series is given several ways on the same publication, which form of the name should be used?

Answer: Rule 1.6B2 prescribes that when variant forms of a series are given, the chief source of information should be chosen. In this case, the series title on the cover is slightly different from that on the half-title page. This inconsistency is not uncommon. Yet L.C. used neither form as the series traced, but instead, used another pre-established form. L.C. keeps a series authority record which can be checked to maintain consistency. In the absence of such a list, the cataloger would have to make a decision consistent with the records in that particular collection.

54-2. The L.C. cataloger traces the subject of this book using the spelling "Dostoyevsky, Fyodor." How are foreign names, particularly in nonroman scripts, spelled for cataloging purposes?

Answer: Rule 22.3C1 prescribes that names in nonroman scripts should be spelled as they are spelled in principal English-language reference sources. Thus, the L.C. cataloger will research a name in biographical dictionaries, encyclopedias, and handbooks to see what form of the name is the most common. Once that is done, an official form of the name is established for L.C. files. This means that there is no consistent or predictable way to know how a name might be spelled. If a library has no access to the L.C. authority list, then the reference collection of the library becomes the authority for the catalog.

54-3. What is the L.C. call number?

Answer: This classification number is clearly indicated in the PG schedule. All that is needed is an author Cutter plus a date.

54-4. When should dates be supplied for persons used as main entries, added entries, or subject entries?

Answer: Rule 22.17 requires dates to be added to a name when that name is identical with one already in the catalog. L.C. has created a name authority file which can be accessed to see if they have added dates to any name.

55-1. Should there be a series statement for this publication? If so, how would it be listed?

Answer: Rule 21.30L allows the creation of series statement for lecture series, usually with the year indicated.

55-2. For the author statement of this book, the L.C. cataloger recorded "[by] David E. Jenkins." Why the bracketed [by]?

Answer: The cataloger was cataloging under old rules which prescribed such a practice. The only bracketed data currently allowed in the statement of responsibility are notations such as "[edited by]" when needed for clarification, Rule 1.1F8

55-3. The L.C. cataloger used the subdivision Addresses, essays, lectures in a subject heading for this book. Is this permissible under current practice?

Answer: No. The 11th edition of LCSH does not allow that subdivision, but the cataloger will often see this subdivision for older works. If the library has an automated system which allows global changes to be made, all the older subdivisions could be eliminated from the catalog. In a manual card catalog, such changes would be much too expensive to make by hand.

#### Focus Problems

56-1. The poems in this book are printed in both English and Italian. How should this be mentioned in the description?

Answer: Rule 2.7B2 dictates that this information be presented in a note. The L.C. practice for the construction of this note is to list the languages in alphabetical order linked by "and." Such a note does not necessarily mean that all the material is multilingual, but that at least the core of the text is.

56-2. Should there be a uniform title for this book? If so, how should it be constructed?

Answer: Generally, a collection of literary works by a single author is given a uniform title. Chapter 25 governs the construction of these titles. It is best to use the L.C. cataloger as the authority for constructing these titles. If access to L.C. authority lists is unavailable, then the local library must create its own policies.

56-3. The L.C. cataloger created added entries for the translators of this work. Is that a normal practice?

Answer: Rule 21.30Kl discourages translators from receiving added entries except for translators of poetry or when the translation is important in its own right. In this case, patrons may ask for a specific translator by name, since translation of poetry and some literary works is as much an art as a methodology.

56-4. The L.C. cataloger assigned no subject headings to this book. Why?

Answer: Literary works often do not receive subject headings unless there is a principal theme of the works. Such a practice might be disputed in the age of computer technology.

56-5. Do writers of a preface merit mention in the statement of responsibility? Are they traced?

Answer: Rule 1.1F1 prescribes that persons mentioned on the title page be listed in the statement of responsibility. Rule 21.30F1 suggests that an added entry not be given for the author of the preface.

If the text is mostly in one language, then the note might read, "In Spanish with 2 stories in English."

57-2. Does the edition statement contain the number of the printing if available?

Answer: Rule 1.2B does not indicate that printing information can be listed in the edition statement.

57-3. In the OCLC record for this book, two of the names are spelled "Alma Gbomez and Cherrbie Moraga." Why?

Answer: The b means that the next letter should have an accent mark over it.

57-4. What type of subject heading does a work receive which is a collection of literature of several Hispanic short story writers, as opposed to a book which might have a number of short stories by one Hispanic author?

Answer: Works of a single author would not usually have a subject heading, but works of various authors would have the genre subdivided by nationality or common author characteristic listed.

### Focus Problems

58-1. How should "A Dolphin book" be treated in the description?

Answer: Publishers often have departments or segments of their publishing house which have separate names. For example, Dell has a section of its publishing called Archway. This is a publisher's series into which certain types of titles are printed and marketed as a group. Such a series is not a true series in a cataloging sense. Rule 2.7B9 provides the possibility of quoting material from the title page or the verso which might be informative. In this case "A Dolphin book" is put in quotes. Should such information have come from any other page, it would have the source indicated. For example "A Dolphin book"--Preface.

58-2. How might the cataloger help the person who might spell out the ampersand in the title and thus miss finding this book?

Answer: The L.C. cataloger has provided an added entry for the title "Beats and company.'

The L.C. cataloger listed one subject for this book as Bohemianism --United States -- Pictorial works. What is Bohemianism?

Answer: A lifestyle sometimes followed by artists, writers, musicians, etc. "Beatniks" led "Bohemian" lifestyles..

# 58-4. What is the DDC number for this work?

Answer: We have here a history of late twentieth century music. Thus it is classed in 810.9 for music and then the time period (0054) is added, as instructed, in Table 3.

59-1. This book is based on a 1983 doctoral dissertation at Oxford University. How should this information be made known?

Answer: The past history of a work, particularly theses, should be indicated in a 500 note. If the work is an actual thesis, then a 502 note is used. See Rule 2.7B13.

59-2. What is the subject heading for a biography, an autobiography, a criticism of an author, or the examination of the works of an artist?

Answer: The name of the person being studied. For literary authors, the subdivision Biography is used for biography and autobiography and Criticism and interpretation for works of criticism.

60-1. For a reproduction of a dissertation, what is recorded in the publication, distribution, etc., area?

Answer: For unpublished theses, Rule 4.4 indicates that only the date of the thesis (including copyright date, if different) is indicated in the publication, distribution, etc., area. The data pertaining to the reproduction are given in a 533 note and the data pertaining to the thesis in a 502 note. The 533 note is always first. Note that L.C.'s form of the name for the degree-granting institution is used in preference to the form of the name given on the thesis.

60-2. The pages are printed on only one side of this publication. How is this recorded?

Answer: Rule 2.5B2 prescribes that the term "leaves" should be used for one-sided pages. This term is also used in the note listing the numbers of the bibliography.

61-1. What is the subject of a criticism of a single work of an author?

Answer: The author's name followed by the name of the work being criticized.

61-2. The cover title is different than the title on the title page. How should this be handled?

Answer: Rule 21.30J1 recommends that an added entry be made for cover titles, caption titles, etc. if significantly different from the title proper.

62-1. How is a television program listed as a subject heading?

Answer: A television program or a movie uses qualifiers in parentheses (Television program) or (Motion picture) after the title.

62-2. The L.C. classifier Cuttered this publication .D3. Why not under the author?

Answer: The classification allows television programs and motion pictures to be Cuttered under the name of the program, thus bringing all television programs of the same name together on the shelf.

62-3. This book is a translation from the Dutch of: Het Geval Dallas. The L.C. cataloger created a uniform title for this work. Why?

Answer: This is a common procedure for works which appear in different languages under different titles. See Rule 25.5Cl. Since "het" is a Dutch word for "the," it is deleted in the uniform title.

63-1. When a book presents substantial biographical/critical information about a painter and presents reproductions of some of the painter's works, what are the subject headings?

Answer: Rule 21.1Al indicates that if the predominant purpose of the book is biography or criticism, the author of the text, not the artist, is the main entry. A subject heading is given for the artist since the book is about his works. An added entry for the artist is also given because he is intellectually responsible for part of the content of the work. If the predominant purpose was to reproduce the artist's work, the artist would be the main entry. An added entry would be made for the author of the text. See Rules 21.29C, 21.16B, and 21.17B.

63-2. What is the L.C. call number?

Answer: Barnet is primarily a painter, so he is classed in ND. A table is needed here. If Barnet were the main entry, the second Cutter would be A4, which is commonly used for collections of reproductions.

64-1. This book is an exhibition of Manet's artworks in all media. What should be the main entry, added entry, and subject headings for this work?

Answer: Rule 21.1Al requires that Manet be the main entry because the book is predominantly reproductions of his work. Note that added entries were made for persons listed on the title page as well as the museums where the exhibitions were held.

64-2. What is the complete title of this work as it should be recorded?

Answer: The L.C. cataloger considered the names of the museums at the top of the title page to be subtitles and recorded them as such in the order listed.

64-3. The L.C. cataloger listed two publishers for this book. Why?

Answer: According to Rule 1.4C5, only the first publisher should have been recorded. Apparently, the second publisher was added because the cataloger felt it performed a different function (distribution). If such was the case, a statement of function should have been added.

64-4. What is the L.C. call number?

Answer: Since the work covers multiple art genres, N (Art in general) rater than ND (Painting) was assigned. Note the second Cutter A4 which represents a collection of reproductions.

65-1. This book is about energy resources in the European Community as well as the world as a whole. What subject(s) should be assigned?

Answer: LCSH uses the term "Power resources" rather than energy resources for this topic. The term "Power resources" allows subdivision by place. Regions identified with an organization or a common characteristic can be used as a place subdivision or geographic entity. Similar name forms have been established for other such multinational groupings such as "Arab countries."

65-2. There are four authors for this publication. What are the main and added entries?

Answer: Rule 21.6B1 allows a main entry for works with 1 to 3 authors, but beyond that, a title main entry is required. When more than three authors are listed, Rules 1.1F5 and 21.3OA1 require that only the first be listed in the statement of responsibility and that the author is the only one to receive an added entry.

65-3. Couldn't "Commission of the European Communities" be the main entry?

Answer: No. According to Rule 21.1B2 this work is not a publication falling into any of the categories listed, i.e., it is not a publication concerning the structure of the organization, its policies, a list of members, etc.; therefore, authorship is retained by the persons listed on the title page.

65-4. The L.C. cataloger created an "At head of title" note. What is that?

Answer: Rule 2.7B6 allows information printed above the title and not part of the title or the statement of responsibility to be given in a note.

65-5. Why can't "Directorate-General for Energy" stand alone as an added entry?

Answer: Rule 24.13 requires that corporate names which imply subordination be entered under the higher body.

66-1. The book is about the coach's role in helping athletes psychologically prepare for sporting events. What should the subject(s) be?

Answer: The first subject should be Coaching (Athletics) since the intent of the book is to aid coaches. Since the book is also about the psychology of sports, the subdivision Psychological aspects, which can be used under any topic, is added to Sports. (The subdivision Psychology can be used under classes of persons).

66-2. What should the L.C. classification be?

Answer: Since the classification should match the first subject, at least to some degree, the book was classified under coaching, not sports psychology.

67-1. The book describes the use of the computer program Lotus 1,2,3 as a tool in business statistics. What should the subject(s) be?

Answer: The cataloger should first determine that the central focus of this book is business statistics with the computer program as the means to create them. Thus, statistics, will receive the first subject and the program a second subject heading. The same reasoning is used in classification. Since the book can only sit in one place on the shelf, it is classed with business statistics, not computer programs. LCSH uses the term "Commercial statistics" rather than "Business statistics." To describe the data processing function being performed using the program, the subdivision "Data processing," which can be added to any topic, was used. LCSH also allows the names of any computer program to be used as a heading. See directions under the term "Computer programs." All computer programs, program languages, and computer equipment can be subjects, using qualifiers such as "Computer program" or "Computer program language" if needed to make sense.

67-2. The name of the publisher on the title page is: John Wiley & Sons, Inc. What is the name recorded for the publisher in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.4D2 allows the cataloger to abridge the name as long as no other publisher has that same name.

68-1. The book concerns services for, and the education of, handicapped children in the United States. What are the subject heading(s)?

Answer: LCSH has established the subdivisions Services for and Education, which can further be subdivided by place, that can be used after any topic. L.C.'s Subject Cataloging Manual contains many valuable lists of subdivisions along with guidance for their use. Among the most important lists are "Most Commonly Used Form and Topical Subdivisions," "Free-floating Subdivisions Used under Names of Persons," and "Free-floating Subdivisions Used under Names of Persons," and "Free-floating Subdivisions Used under Names of Places." Some subdivisions can be used in more than one of these categories, but the lists are considerably different and it is vital that the appropriate list be consulted when formulating subdivisions.

68-2. What is the main entry for this publication?

Answer: Rule 21.7B1 requires that edited works be entered under title.

68-3. What form of the name for the publisher is used in the description?

Answer: "A College Hill Publication" listed on the title page is really not the division's name. The verso gives the better official name for the publisher as "College-Hill Press." Rule 1.4D1 allows the name of a publishing division as long as that name can stand on its own.

68-4. There are four subject headings listed on the OCLC record with the tag number "650 2." Where do these headings come from?

Answer: These headings are from the National Library of Medicine MESH list.

69-1. What are the subject heading(s) for this book/travel guide about Ontario?

Answer: LCSH allows the names of places to be used as subject headings. The names of states and provinces in the U.S. and Canada do not need the name of the country as a qualifier. Here, the cataloger has decided to assign two headings; the first, the place in general (the dominant topic), the second, the place with a subdivision --Description and travel (a lesser topic). L.C. subject heading practice encourages such extra headings when approximately 20 per cent of a work concerns an aspect which is not dominant.

## Focus Problems

70-1. What should the subject heading(s) be for this book about the Reagan presidency?

Answer: Since this is not a biographical work about Reagan, but about U.S. politics under his presidency, a heading for politics comes first with a secondary heading for Reagan.

70-2. The L.C. cataloger when establishing the form of the name for Ronald Reagan did not include a birth year in the entry. Why?

Answer: If there are no competing entries under the name, the L.C. cataloger is not required to add the birth and death dates for an author. This is one reason to use the L.C. authority files as the authority for a local library's cataloging department.

70-3. The L.C. cataloger treated "The Next Four Years" as part of the main title rather than as a subtitle by putting a comma rather than a colon after "Reagan." Why?

Answer: Short main titles should be extended in length as much as grammar and logic dictate. The longer title allows for better access.

70-4. The L.C. cataloger chose to make an added entry for Congressional Quarterly, Inc. even though it is not usual to make an added entry for a publisher. Why?

Answer: Since there is no person listed as being responsible for the intellectual content on the title page, Rule 21.30El allows the cataloger to create an added entry for the corporate body.

70-5. Should the ISBN be recorded in the description?

Answer: Rule 1.8B1 requires that the ISBN be indicated.

# Focus Problems

71-1. As a biography, what is the subject heading(s) for this and other biographical works?

Answer: Section #H1330 of the Subject Cataloging Manual discusses biographical works and their subject headings. The person's name is always a subject heading whether the work is a biography or an autobiography, and whether or not the person's name is in the title of the book. Generally, the career/profession/office/field of work is also brought out in subject headings. A place connected with the person might also be used for a subject heading, or a topic discussed in the book as a part of the biographical material might be used. For example France--Politics and Government--1945-might be used for a biography of a person who played a significant role in the French government after World War II. For this case, two headings were selected, one for Chaplin's work in motion pictures and the second for his work as a comedian.

71-2. This book was published by one publisher in England and another one in the U.S. How is this noted in the publication, distribution, etc., area?

Answer: Rule 1.4C5 requires that both publishers be listed when the foreign publisher and place are listed first on the title page.

71-3. How are the two different copyright dates handled when they are different and from different countries?

Answer: Rule 1.4F6 states that the latest date of copyright is transcribed.

71-4. The L.C. cataloger lists one of the subject headings as: Moving-picture actors and actresses—United States—Biography. How are the two subdivisions constructed and how is the order determined?

Answer: LCSH indicates that Moving-picture actors and actresses can be subdivided by place. The subdivision Biography can be used after any topic, but always after the place name.

72-1. L.C. actually assigned eight subject headings for this book. Why?

Answer: L.C. felt that in addition to subjects for wealth, capitalists, and financiers, subjects were needed for the general history, economic history, social history, and political history of the region plus the history of coal mining and the energy industries. Since L.C. has not established a name form for "Eastern Kentucky," the name of the state as a whole was used.

# 72-2. What is the L.C. call number?

Answer: HC107.K4 is the classification for the economic conditions or economic history of Kentucky. When a special topic is present, as in this case, a "3" is added to the .K4 followed by the Cutter number .W4, which is derived, as the instructions indicate, from the list given under HC 79. With this done, it is still necessary to Cutter for the author, Caudill. But there are already two Cutters, and L.C. does allow three Cutters except for maps, music scores, and sound recordings. So to accommodate the author, "3" is added to the second Cutter. If Mason were the author, "5" or thereabouts would be added, and if Thompson were the author, "8" or thereabouts would be added. Nobody said L.C. classification was easy!

# Focus Problems

73-1. The title of this book is sufficient for subject analysis. What should the subject heading(s) be?

Answer: The L. C. cataloger provided two really co-equal subjects for this work, one based on the politics of the period and the other emphasizing the nationalism aspect. Notice that "Ukraine," like other states of the Soviet Union, does not need to be qualified by country. Note also that the now obsolete geographic name "Russia" was used instead of the current form "Soviet Union."

73-2. The title page lists the author's name as "Kenneth C. Farmer." The L.C. cataloger used the name "Kenneth Farmer" for the main entry. Why?

Answer: Evidently, previous works by this same person were written without the use of the middle initial. According to Rule 22.2Al the cataloger would have used the predominant form of the name.

73-3. This book has a publisher which has a U.S. location, but it is only available from a distributor listed on the verso. How is this availability treated in the publication, distribution, etc.,, area?

Answer: According to Rule 1.4D, exclusive distributors are to be listed as a part of the publication, distribution, etc., area after the name of the publisher. Note that the initial letter in "distributors" should have been capitalized.

# 74-1. What should the subject headings for this book be?

Answer: Since the relations between Africa and the U.S. are not confined to a specific type, such as "Foreign relations" (meaning foreign political relations), "Foreign economic relations," or "Military relations," the general term "Relations" is used by L.C. As is done in many such cases, two subject headings are created for geographical areas in reversed positions (Africa ... U.S.; U.S... Africa) so that patrons can find the work no matter where they look,

When -- Foreign opinion is used after a place, the complementary subject is Public opinion --

Note that Africa -- Study and teaching -- United States is the form used for African studies in the U.S. Be aware that terminology such as "African studies," "Russian studies," etc., sometimes is used for general collections about the place instead of the process of studying the place.

# 74-2. How should the series be recorded?

Answer: Rule 1.6G1 requires that the ISSN for the series be included in addition to the title and the number within the series.

74-3. How should the place of publication be recorded since the title page lists two?

Answer: Rule 1.4C5 requires that only the first place of publication be recorded in this case. Rule 1.4C3 allows the name of the state to be added to the place name when necessary for identification.

# 75-1. What is/are the L.C. subject heading(s) for this book?

Answer: A subject heading is needed for the ethnic group. L.C. usually establishes names for primitive peoples in the form indicated. A secondary subject for ethnology of the area is almost automatic. In this case, the subdivision Field work, a free-floater under topics, was added. Because the book was partly autobiographical, a subject was made for the author. In addition, a subject was made for the social conditions of the area. As a whole, it is helpful to have a subject beginning with the geographical area when it is one of the focuses of the book, even when such a subject is not absolutely required by the book's content.

75-2. How are pages of plates to be recorded in the physical description?

Answer: Rule 2.5B10 requires that pages of plates be recorded right after the paging.

# 76-1. What is/are the L.C. subject headings for this book?

Answer: The first two subjects cover the basic topics of the book. Land tenure might not be readily ascertained since L.C. does not make a cross-reference from Land ownership to Land tenure. The use of the subdivision History under both is needed because the topics are being treated historically. The major complication of these subjects is that Great Britain, not England is used when the subdivision Politics and government is applied. In addition, the same pattern of using Great Britain instead of England is employed when the subdivision History is applied.

# 76-2. What part of this long title is considered the subtitle?

Answer: Rule 1.1E does not give any clear guidance on when the main title ends and other title information begins. Logic would suggest that the main title should end after the dates. Note that the title after the dates has somewhat smaller type.

#### Focus Problems

77-1. What is/are the L.C. subject headings for this book?

Answer: The first and third subjects complement each other. When a city is used as a subdivision under Buildings, a heading is also made for the city subdivided by Buildings, structures, etc. The subject for architecture is clearly needed. The fourth subject is also desirable because books of this nature typically serve in part as a general guidebook to the area. Note that Guide-books is consistently used as a subdivision under all four subjects. When suitable, subdivisions like this should be applied uniformly. Note the two levels of geographical subdivision under subjects two and three. Two such levels are the maximum allowed.

77-2. How should the publisher be recorded?

Answer: Rule 1.4D5 states that if two or more agencies are named as publisher, then both should be listed.

77-3. How should the word "compleat" be treated in the cataloging record?

Answer: Resist the impulse to edit title pages unless you are certain there is an error, in which case Rule 1.0F1 allows a correction to be made in square brackets.

77-4. The L.C. cataloger did not make an added entry for the photographer. Why not?

Answer: L.C. makes added entries for photographers as access points only when their contributions are major. Similarly, illustrators are seldom given access points, except for juvenile books, when they are usually traced.

77-5. The L.C. cataloger added 0453 to the DDC number. Where did this number come from and what is its meaning?

Answer: Directions for this addition come from 913-919. The number means the historical period of L.A. County and is derived from directions at 973.1-973.9.

78-1. What is/are the L.C. subject headings for this book?

Answer: L.C. uses Antiquities as a subdivision for the archaeology, ruins, old art works, etc. of a place. L.C. also typically adds a secondary heading with the pattern [country] — Antiquities whenever the antiquities are local. Note that in L.C. practice, Pottery means artistic objects made of ceramics. Also note that although Pottery can be subdivided geographically, L.C. uses Pottery, Greek — Greece — Corinth rather than Pottery — Greece — Corinth. The majority of art forms are handled by such inverted headings, but many are not. For instance, in Example 77 about Los Angeles, no inversion was used with Architecture. This strange inconsistency is one of the most confusing aspects of the L.C. subject heading system. Further note the subject heading and added entry for Amyx. This is a festschrift, which means that an added entry is automatically made for the person being honored, and that a subject heading is made if there is even a slight amount of information about the

78-2. Should the author's bibliography be included in the cataloging record?

Answer: In this case, the item is a festschrift and a subject heading was made for Amyx. His bibliography, therefore, is important to bring out as a note.

78-3. How should Mario Aldo Del Chiaro's name be recorded as an added entry?

Answer: Rule 22.5D1 requires that English names be entered with the "Del" as the first part of the surname.

79-1. What is/are the L.C. subject headings for this book?

Answer: As in Example 78, L. C. uses Art, American and parallel inversions for the art of a place. The second subject is a useful device to catch the historical period of the art. The pattern of the fifth subject may seem to contradict the pattern of the first one, but L.C. interprets the first as meaning art produced in New England and the fifth as meaning art currently located in New Bedford. These two types of headings could be called rival headings. Subjects three and four cover the subject of the art and the persons creating the art. The sixth subject for the museum is needed because the art is from the permanent collection of the museum. Note the use of Catalogs as a subdivision for five out of the six subjects. That subdivision under the Whalers (Persons) subject would have been quite erroneous since the catalog is only applicable to the art objects, not the persons.

79-2. What is the main entry for this book and the consequent added entries?

Answer: Rule 21.4B1 dictates that official publications such as museum catalogs be entered under the name of the museum with an added entry for the person who compiles the work.

79-3. The L.C. cataloger seems to have been in a number building mood to create a DDC number with 18 numbers after the decimal. While such numbers are theoretically possible, what would be a more practical solution?

Answer: To classify this work simply with paintings, possibly adding whaling (63928) to the meaning. Few libraries would have enough material to build further.

80-1. What are the L.C. subject headings for this book?

Answer: The first subject Copepoda is the most specific heading that can be assigned. Copepoda cannot have the subdivision Biochemistry because that subdivision is not allowed under headings for species and groupings of animals. Note that a broader heading Crustacea has been given so that all the subclasses of this animal form can be retrieved under one heading. Still another broader heading, Marine invertebrates has been given to cover the concept "marine" since Copepoda can be freshwater or marine. Does this violate Cutter's principles of subject headings? Even more basic, does it provide successful subject access? Both are good discussion points.

80-2. For a collection of writings, how much of the work can be listed in a contents note? Should authors and titles in a contents note be given added entries?

Answer: How many items to list in a contents note is at the discretion of the cataloger (Rule 2.7B18 does not set limits), but reason should prevail. Making added entries is also at the discretion of the cataloger. Rule 21.30M1 provides some guidance.

80-3. What are the main and added entries for this book?

Answer: Rule 21.7B1 dictates that works produced under editorial direction be entered under title, with added entries made for the editor(s).

80-4. How is the place of publication for this work recorded?

Answer: Rule 1.4C3 advises that the name of the country, state, province, etc., be added if it is considered necessary for identification.

80-5. The L.C. cataloger recorded two publisher names for this work. Why?

Answer: Clarendon Press is really a part of Oxford University Press. Since both are listed (title page and verso), Rule 1.4D5 allows both to be listed.

80-6. What is the L.C. classification for this book?

Answer: It is classed under the specific biological organisms (Copepoda) instead of under biochemistry or marine invertebrates in general.

81-1. Choose and give the form of the main entry.

Answer: Since this is not an official communication by the Church, Rule 21.4D2 states that the main entry should be under the Pope's individual name. Rule 22.16B describes how to construct the name of the pope for the main entry.

81-2. The L.C. cataloger assigned the subject heading: Catholic Church -- Collected works. What rules cover the name of the Church as used here? Why not Roman Catholic Church?

Answer: Both in Rule 24.27 and in LCSH, "Catholic Church" has been chosen as the official name for cataloging purposes.

82-1. In this case, the two federal laws were not chosen as the main entry. Why? How are they traced so that a person can locate them by the name of the law?

Answer: In this case, the book is about the laws, not texts of the laws; therefore, the book does not follow Rule 21.1B2b. Since the book is an edited piece, the title becomes the main entry. The names of the two laws should be added entries, the form of which is governed by Rule 21.31. Note that the name of the jurisdiction, the title of the law, and the date are indicated.

82-2. How is the physical description of a looseleaf publication handled?

Answer: Rule 2.5B9 describes how to treat loose-leaf publications.

82-3 The L.C. cataloger assigned two DDC numbers to this item, one in laws and one in the civil procedure number. Can an item be correctly classified in more than one number?

Answer: There are a number of places in the schedules which provide alternate classification numbers. In addition, local practice can often influence where an item should be classified.

83-1. What is the main entry for biblical quotations?

Answer: Since the book consists of quotations, the main entry is the Bible itself. Speake is given an added entry. Rule 25.18A9 gives the rules for constructing the uniform title for selections from sacred scriptures.

83-2. Why isn't 1982 (the year first published) used as the date of publication?

Answer: Rule 1.4F1 says that the year of the edition given in the edition statement is used. In this case, there is no edition area. However, the edition in hand was published by Facts On File Inc. in 1983.

84-1. Since Byron was known as Lord Byron, how is his name listed as the main entry?

Answer: Rule 22.6Al gives the rules for nobility. Luckily, in this case, the actual form of Byron is given as the first example, although his birth and death dates are not included in the example, but L.C. follows Rule 22.17 whenever dates are available for a person.

84-2. The L.C. cataloger used a uniform title for this publication. What would it be?

Answer: Rule 25.9A provides the rules for using Selections as the uniform title for authors. L.C. usually adds the date of publication to such uniform titles.

85-1. Who is H.D.? Who is John Helforth? How is the main entry constructed for this work?

Answer: We have here a female poet writing a novel using both the names H.D. (which she used regularly) and a male pseudonym. Rule 22.10 requires such names to be entered in the form used most often (H.D.) and in direct order. L.C. also adds the name Hilda Doolittle in parentheses after H.D., following the provisions of Rule 22.18A.

85-2. What is the edition statement for this book?

Answer: Sorting out the information on the verso shows that the book in hand is the New Directions Fine Press Edition. This is recorded in the edition statement and the date of this edition is used as the date of publication.

85-3. The L.C. cataloger assigned no subject heading to this work. Why?

Answer: Works of fiction are not generally given subject headings.

85-4. What is the L.C. call number for this book?

Answer: It is obviously classed under the literature number for the author. Note that the second Cutter N5 stands for the title of the work. Compare this call number, which represents the text of a work, with the call numbers for works about a literary author, as given in examples 87 and 89.

86-1. What is the main entry? What are the added entries?

Answer: The first inclination would be to use the Court as the main entry. However, this publication was not issued under the authority of the Court, and therefore does not receive a corporate main entry (Rule 21.1B2). Schwartz is the compiler of the work of others, he does not qualify for the main entry (Rule 21.7B1). Therefore, the collection is entered under title. Added entries are made for the name of the Court (Rule 24.23A) and for Schwartz.

86-2. The L.C. cataloger used United States. Supreme Court as a subject heading. Why?

Answer: The cataloger determined that the court was one of the subjects as well as being responsible for the intellectual content of the work.

87-1. George Orwell's real name was Eric Arthur Blair. Why is the form Orwell, George used as a subject entry for this work?

Answer: Rule 22.2B1 prescribes that a person using one pseudonym consistently for literary works should be entered under that pseudonym.

87-2. How should the complete series area be prepared for this book?

Answer: Various rules under 1.6 should be used in this case to record the name of the series, the ISSN, and the number within the series.

87-3. What is the L.C. call number for this book?

Answer: This is a review of a concept given in example 2. This work, of course, is classed under the literature number for the author. Note that the second Cutter begins with a Z, not with a Cutter representing the main entry. For this type of classification number, high Z Cutters are used for works about the literary author. The proper literature table must always be consulted. See example 89 for a similar situation.

88-1. What is the main entry for this work? Give the correct form of the name for the main entry.

Answer: Rule 21.6C1 requires that materials by two authors with no principal authorship attributed be entered under the first named person with an added entry under the other person. In creating the form of Churchill's name, the cataloger should discover that the title "Sir" was commonly associated with Churchill's name, so Rule 22.1C requires that the title be added to his name. Contrast this usage with Agatha Christie's name in example #89

88-2. The L.C. cataloger provided duplicate author/added entry and subject entries for Churchill and Roosevelt. Why?

Answer: Writers of correspondence are both the authors and the subjects of their writings.

88-3. Why aren't Churchill's and Roosevelt's official corporate entries used as author entries for this work?

Answer: Rule 24.20 indicates that only official documents of government officials acting in their official capacities are entered under official corporate entries. Personal letters are not considered official government documents.

## Focus Problems

89-1. Agatha Christie had the title "Dame." Should this title be included in the entry for her name?

Answer: Rule 22.1C allows the use of a title of nobility if that title was commonly associated with the person. In this case, Christie did not use the title on her works. Therefore, it is not included in her name, unlike Churchill's name in example 88.

89-2. The L.C. subject cataloger assigned the heading: Authors, English -- 20th century -- Biography. Why?

Answer: Biographical works always receive the name of the person treated as a subject heading. If that person is associated with a profession or group, the name of that group is used with the subdivision Biography. Note that autobiography also uses the subdivision Biography.

## Focus Problems

90-1. What is the main entry? What is the correct form to be used?

Answer: Rule 21.37A requires that the full text or selections from the text of sacred scriptures be entered under the uniform title for that work. The form of the entry for a sacred scripture is governed by Rule 25.17 and the form of the rest of the uniform title by Rule 25.18.

90-2. What is the L.C. call number for this work?

Answer: Call numbers without Cutter numbers do occur in the various places in the L.C. Classification Schedules. They look odd, but they are legal. For another such call number structure, see example 37.

91-1. As a subject heading, the L.C. cataloger used the name of this local church. What form should this heading take?

Answer: Rule 24.10 governs the construction of names for local churches.

## Focus Problems

92-1. The name of the California Legislature is used as a subject heading by the L.C. cataloger. What form should this name take?

Answer: Rule 24.21 gives the correct method of dealing with legislative names.

92-2. The L.C. cataloger established the main entry as: Muir, William Ker. Why?

Answer: Research in L.C.'s files must have provided the name of William Ker Muir as the predominant name to use according to Rule 22.2A. According to Rule 22.15C the term Jr. would not normally be a part of the entry unless required to distinguish between two or more persons with the same name when dates of birth and death were not available.

93-1. After doing some research on Averroes, construct the main entry and the uniform title for this work.

Answer: Averroes was a Spanish-Arab philosopher famous for his commentaries on Aristotle. Rue 25.4A governs the creation of works created before 1501.

93-2. The L. C. cataloger made two added entries involving titles. What should they be?

Answer: The cataloger created an added entry for Aristotle's Poetics because the text of Poetics is in the work. This is covered by Rule 21.30Ml. The cataloger also used the authority given by Rule 21.29C to make an added entry for the title of the book beginning with the word "Middle." This was done because the title proper began with an author's surname.

93-3. We have here a translation. Under what circumstances is the translator given a main or added entry?

Answer: According to Rule 21.14A, translators are never given a main entry position. An added entry is made for the translator if that person falls under one or more of the categories listed in Rule 21.30K1. In this case, categories C and E both apply.

# Focus Problems

94-1. This is a sample of an Italian work written before 1501. What is the main entry, and what form does it take?

Answer: Rule 25.4A covers the creation of works written before 1501 including the creation of the uniform title for this work which is "Purgatorio." As with other classical works, the language of the current edition is added after the title portion of the uniform title.

94-2. What should be done with translators and titles to help patrons find this book?

Answer: As in example 93, Rules 21.14A, 21.30K1, and 21.29C are important in tracing translators and variations in the title.

94-3. What should the L.C. call number be?

Answer: This is a complete translation of Dante's Purgatorio. Translations of Purgatorio are assigned numbers in the range PQ4315.3-.37. That range of numbers is divided like PQ 4315.2-.27, and since 4315.2 is for complete translations, the call number for the item in hand is PQ4315.3. Since the L.C. schedule says to Cutter by translator, the L.C. cataloger added the .M8 Cutter.

95-1. How is an unpaged book treated in the physical description?

Answer: Rule 2.5B7 provides guidance on how to treat unpaged works. In this case, the L.C. cataloger actually counted the pages and enclosed the count in brackets.

95-2. What is the main entry for this work?

Answer: Since the book is primarily reproductions of the artist's work, then according to Rule 21.1A1, the artist should have the main entry because he is responsible for the intellectual content of the work. Longnecker will be given an added entry.

95-3. The L.C. cataloger gave Dusti Bonge a subject entry. Why?

Answer: The book contains material both by and about the artist.

# Focus Problems

96-1. The L.C. cataloger gave an added entry for IFLA but entered it as International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions. Section of Art Libraries. Why the change in the association's name?

Answer: When the cataloger verified the corporate name, a change in length was noted and recorded. Check Rule 24.2 for details. The form of the name in the title area is recorded exactly as it appears on the title page.

96-2. How are the four parallel titles dealt with in the title paragraph and as traced titles?

Answer: Rule 1.1D2 prescribes that parallel titles be listed in the title paragraph with a space equals sign space between each title. The rule is unclear on how many parallel titles should be indicated in the description. In this case, L.C. listed all four. Since all four are indicated, all four should be traced. L.C. practice suggests that the English parallel title, if present, and no more than three others should be described and traced.

96-3. Where is the fact that the text is in various languages mentioned in the description?

Answer: Rule 2.7B2 indicates that the language(s) of the item is given in a note unless apparent from the description. L.C. practice dictates that when multiple languages are listed in a note, they are listed in alphabetical order unless one is predominant or clearly more important. In such a case, the more important language is given first. For example, a book in French with a few English sections would be indicated: In French, with some English.

## Focus Problems

97-1. Leonardo da Vinci's name is a problem for catalogers, and the way L.C. handles this name becomes a problem for patrons. What is the problem and a solution?

Answer: Rule 22.8A1 gives Leonardo's form of entry as an example of a name entered under the given name when there is no surname. Because da Vinci is the city of his birth and because many people are mistaken thinking that bavinci indicates a surname, confusion in the catalog arises. The cataloger in this case enters the name by the rule, but must provide a cross-reference in the catalog if patrons are expected to locate the name.

97-2. How are dissertations treated in the physical description?

Answer: Rule 2.7B13 describes how to create a note for a doctoral dissertation. Since this is not an actual dissertation, but a reworking of it, a general note, not a dissertation note, is given.

97-3. If there are so many of Correggio's works represented in this book, why isn't the main entry under him?

Answer: Rule 21.17B1 discusses at length decision rules to be applied to reproductions of artworks with text. In this case, the text by the author is substantial (258 pages versus 123 plates) and his name appears on the title page.

98-1. The L.C. cataloger provides an added entry for the cavalry. What is the form of this entry?

Answer: Rule 24.24A1 provides guidance for creating entries for army units.

98-2. The L.C. cataloger created six different subject headings for this book. Can you create that many? Why should the cataloger attempt to create multiple subject access points?

Answer: With so many different aspects to this book, multiple subjects are definitely needed. Whether two different catalogers would apply the exact same six is certainly questionable, but multiple subjects tend to expand the probabilities of subject retrieval. The policy of L.C. over the last few years has been to increase the number of subject access points substantially. Not too long ago, the average number of headings assigned to a work was about two. Some pressures for fewer headings came from the limited amount of space on a catalog card and the number of additional cards that would be required for a set. Computerization has changed these restrictions. Public opinion, in addition, seems to generally favor more subjects now.

98-3. How are folded maps in pockets to be dealt with in the description?

Answer: Rules 2.7810 and 2.7811 provide guidance for describing accompanying materials in a note.

99-1. Construct the uniform title for this work.

Answer: Rule 25.4B1 instructs the cataloger to use a well-established English title for a work originally written in classical Greek. In this case, "Seven Against Thebes" is the established English form.

99-2. How is the Greek and English text treated in the description?

Answer: Rule 2.7B2 states that language of the text is to be treated in a note. The form of the note is similar to the example given in the answer to problem 96-3.

99-3. What should the subject headings be?

Answer: This is a very difficult subject problem. Since this work is a play and — Drama can be used under any subject, the L.C. cataloger chose to add that subdivision to the heading for the myth of Seven Against Thebes and to the heading for the city of Thebes, Greece. Literary texts usually do not receive subject headings.

Focus Problems

100-1. What is the main entry for this publication?

Answer: Since this is an explanation of the law, it is not policy, and therefore, the committee is not the main entry. Rule 21.1B2 covers this, but not very clearly. It suggests that all committee reports should have the committee as the main entry, but this is only true when the report is a statement of official policy. This is a very tricky area.

100-2. What is the form of the name of the committee?

Answer: The name of the committee, which has to be traced one way or another, is covered by Rule 24.21B.

100-3. L.C. indicated the exact address of the publisher in the imprint. Why?

Answer: Rule 1.4C7 indicates that the full address of publishers other than major trade publishers can be optionally given in the imprint. Most libraries do not use this option very often.

This file contains Dewey Decimal Classification numbers arranged by example number. For the most part, 082 numbers are from the 19th edition of Dewey as was assigned by the L.C. cataloger. All numbers have been checked in the 20th edition. Where there was a discrepancy, an 092 tag was added.
